

From our **WWGA Handbook** and new information, a change from prior policy:

POST YOUR SCORE: After your round, make appropriate adjustments to your score (see Equitable Stroke Control below) and post your own score into the course's handicap computer (or later from the AWGA eGolfbag website). For WWGA tournaments, put an "A" for Away when posting, except the four State Medallion rounds (February [cancelled due to rain], March, April, and June), post a "T" for Tournament.

Course Handicap	Maximum Number on Any Hole
9 or less	Double Bogey
10 through 19	7
20 through 29	8
30 through 39	9
40 or more	10

WWGA no longer has a "Home" course (posted as "H") because the AWGA lists us as a league "without real estate." Per the AWGA, an "A" posting carries the same weight as an "H" posting, so WWGA can post all rounds at the City of Phoenix municipal courses as "A." Just the State Medallion rounds need to be "T" postings. See the website (www.wwgaphx.com) under Tournaments for how to post each month.

WWGA changed this policy based on what the USGA classifies as Tournaments (emphasis added by WWGA):

Posting a Tournament Score

A *tournament score* is a score made in a competition organized and conducted by a committee in charge of the competition. The competition must identify a winner(s) based on a *stipulated round(s)*, and must be played under the principles of *The Rules of Golf*.

The committee (preferably the *Handicap Committee*, in consultation with the committee in charge of the competition) must determine in advance if these conditions are met, and announce in advance whether the score must be identified by the letter "T" when posed. **Routine events such as regular play days normally are not to be designated as T-scores because they are not significant in the traditions, schedules, formats, and membership of the club.**
